

## 1) Activities Committee Member

### Role Description

Chaired by the Activities and Employability Officer, and co-chaired by the Sports Officer, the Activities Committee is responsible for:

- Representing all students involved in student groups, sports, volunteering, and other student-led activities
- Overseeing, allocating and reviewing the Guild's Student Groups grants
- Making recommendations on the Guild's position on activities and development issues
- Discuss and make decisions on student ideas and policy proposals related to student groups, societies and sports clubs
- Support the Activities and Employability Officer and Sports Officer to achieve their manifesto aims
- Reviewing the Guild's Student Groups Policy, and ensure that student groups follow this Policy



There are six positions available on the Activities Committee:

- Student Groups Representative x2
- Sports Representative x2
- Student member (Open Place) x3

### Student Groups Representative x2

The Student Groups Representatives will represent all UoB students involved in student groups, clubs, volunteering, and other student-led activities at UoB. You don't have to be on a Student Group Committee or a member of a group to apply for these positions – you just have to be a student at UoB, and be passionate about student groups and student-led activities! These positions are also ideal if you have background in groups, activities and student group committees (e.g. Student Groups Executive).

### **Sports Representative x2**

The Sports Representatives will represent all UoB students involved in sport at UoB. You don't have to be on a Sports Club committee or a member of a Sports Club to apply for these positions, you just have to be a student at UoB, and be passionate about sport at UoB to apply! These positions are also ideal if you have background in sports or other student-led sports activities!

### **Student Member (Open Place) x3**

The Student Member roles are open places, and are available to any UoB student. Students in these roles will be responsible for representing all UoB students in general.

## **2) Campaigns Committee Member**

### **Role Description**



Campaigns Committee has three main roles:

- Overseeing the Guild's campaigning work
- Supporting student led campaigns
- Discussing and making decisions on student campaign proposals, and ideas and policy related to campaigns

The committee membership includes the Guild President, Campaigns Officer, Ethical and Environmental Officer and five open places. The open places are for any UoB students, are available in this election.

As part of the Campaigns Committee, you will support impactful campaigns that we run and support at the Guild, and you can get involved with campaigns that you feel are passionate about. Some examples of previous and present Guild campaigns include Black Voices Campaign, Fossil Free UoB and Climate Emergency.

### 3) Education Committee Member

#### Role Description

Education Committee oversees and makes decisions on ideas and policy proposals about students' academic experiences, academic policy and developments related to education, and the Reps Fund. The Committee's membership includes your Education Officer (the Chair),

Postgraduate Officer and International Officer, 5 elected College Reps and 5 elected students. The 5 student (open) roles are open in Autumn Elections for any UoB student throughout the year, alongside the College Reps, they will also help to support the Officers to achieve their written statement (manifesto) aims.



#### College Reps

There will be one College Rep from each of the Colleges. As well as sitting on the Education Committee, College Reps also attend College-level University Committees such as College Education Committee (CEC) to represent college-level feedback from students in their College.

There are some College Rep positions available, however many some College Reps were elected in the Summer elections. Please see the 'roles' section on the elections webpage to see if there are any College Rep positions available within your College

#### **Elected Full Members** (Representative x4, Commuter Student Representative x1)

##### Elected Representative x4

This role is open to any UoB student. There are 4 positions available. On the Committee, you will be expected to represent your peers discussing issues and ideas relating to the academic experience.

##### Elected Commuter Student Representative x1

This role is available for any commuter student at UoB (any student who lives at the same address during term time and the holidays - this could mean living alone, with parents/guardians, or a family

of your own). There is 1 position available. On the Committee, you will be expected to represent your peers, discussing issues and ideas relating to the academic experience of commuter students.

#### 4) Welfare & Liberation Committee Member

##### Role Description

Chaired by the Welfare & Community Officer (WCO), the Welfare & Liberation Committee will be responsible for:

- Discussing and making decisions on ideas, policy and campaign proposals relating to welfare, wellbeing, equality & diversity, and liberation issues
- Support the delivery of History Month campaigns and activities
- Support the WCO and Liberation Part-Time Officers to achieve their written statement (manifesto) aims
- Overseeing campaigning and representation activity relating to student welfare and students represented by the five Liberation Part-Time Officers (and the intersections of those groups)
- Make recommendations on the Guild's position on welfare and liberation issues



There are four positions available on the Welfare & Liberation Committee:

- Postgraduate Representative
- International Representative
- Student Member (Open Place) x2

##### Postgraduate Representative

The Postgraduate Representative will represent all PGT and PGR students at UoB on this committee, and provide feedback on discussions and decisions from the view of a Postgraduate student.

##### International Representative

The International Representative will represent all International students at UoB on this committee, and provide feedback on discussions and decisions from the view of an International student.

**Student Member (Open Place) x2**

These places are open to any student at UoB.
